Qualifications and Experience: Required - Earned doctorate from an APA-Accredited program in School Psychology (or closely related field) by September 1, 2015; evidence of scholarly potential; licensed or license eligible as a psychologist in Colorado, and experience working with ethnically/culturally diverse groups; Preferred – University teaching experience, Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA); involvement in APA/NASP/state association; experience in K-12 school setting; commitment to diversity and social justice as evidenced by experience, research, or service, and potential for securing external funding.

Position Description: This is a full-time, tenure track position in the School Psychology Program located in the College of Education and Behavioral Sciences at the University of Northern Colorado (UNC). Responsibilities include: teaching graduate courses in the areas of academic intervention, crisis intervention, childhood development, and supervising field experiences for the Ed.S. and Ph.D. school psychology programs; evidence of and/or potential for conducting program-related and productive research in school psychology; advising specialist and doctoral students, including advising/directing dissertations and other student research; assisting in the recruitment and retention of a diverse student population; participating in University and community service; and writing grants for external funding.

Salary and Benefits: Commensurate with qualifications and experience. Benefits include health, life, and dental insurance, as well as a selection of several defined contribution retirement programs. Summer employment and other teaching opportunities may be available. Starting date of August 15, 2015
