Job Description Summary	Webster University invites applicants for a 12-month tenure-track faculty at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor. Webster University's school psychology program is multicultural, international, and child-centered. Excellence in teaching is expected. Candidates must also pursue a program of research and scholarship in their chosen areas of school psychology and publish regularly in professional journals. This position is located in St. Louis/Webster Groves, MO, with opportunities to teach at international campuses.
Minimum Qualifications	Applicants must have an earned doctorate in school psychology. Applicant must also be a Board- Certified Behavior Analyst. We seek a professionally credentialed, nationally certified school psychology faculty member with practice-based knowledge, ability to establish relationships with school districts, with a minimum of three years of experience working as a school psychologist in elementary and secondary public schools, especially with students from multicultural and international backgrounds.
Preferred Qualifications	 Preferred areas of expertise are as follows: School-based mental health services for culturally and linguistically diverse populations. Background in special education and a school crisis prevention and intervention specialist (PREPaRE trainer). Culturally responsive evidence-based interventions focused on academic, behavioral, and mental health support. International children's rights and school psychology. Exceptional youth - including students with disabilities, those with special gifts and talents, and "twice-exceptional" youth.
Physical Demands	Within the range of the normal office environment.
Essential Duties	 Teach with a strong interactive focus. Advise graduate students. This 12-month position requires a teaching load of 8 courses per year. Course releases may apply depending on administrative appointments related to the programs. Participate in curriculum development, implementation, and review. Serve as liaison with the Behavior Analyst Certification Board®. Assist in data collection, data analysis and reports as required by the University and School of Education as well as state, regional, and national accreditation agencies. Explore opportunities for additional collaboration with school districts and in-service opportunities for educators. Engage in service and make professional contributions to the department, school, university, and community. Collaborate with graduate students as they prepare to present research at international and national conferences and publish in international journals in psychology and education.
